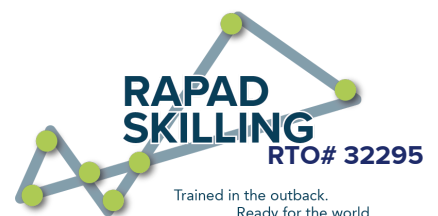

CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services

Course Overview

To achieve CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services, a total of 9 units of competency must be completed, comprising of 5 core units and 4 elective units. This is a self paced course that will take between 6 - 18 months depending on the learner and their individual circumstances. Training is available in a variety of locations and can vary depending on the delivery mode selected. Our RAPAD Skilling trainers travel to the seven RAPAD council regions of Longreach, Winton, Barcaldine, Blackall-Tambo, Boulia, Diamantina, Barcoo and beyond.

Work Placement

Work placement is not compulsory to complete this qualification, however can be an advantage.

Credit Transfer

Credit Transfer is available and free of charge if the learner currently already holds a unit of competency and can provide evidence documents.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is conducted for experienced workers seeking to have their current skills and knowledge acknowledged. The RPL process requires the collection of evidence documents to support the determined outcome.

Award

On successful completion of all units of competency and course requirements, the learner will be awarded the CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services.
