This information booklet is designed to provide you with information about the services provided by RAPAD Skilling and our approach to providing you a safe, fair and supported environment to participate in training and assessment. This booklet does not provide you with specific information about a particular course offered by RAPAD Skilling. - To be responsible for your own learning and development by participating actively and positively and by ensuring that you maintain progress with learning modules.
- To monitor your own progress by ensuring that assessment deadlines are observed.
- To utilise facilities and RAPAD Skilling publications with respect and to honour our copyrights and prevent our publication from being distributed to unauthorised persons.
- To respect other learners and RAPAD Skilling staff members and their right to privacy and confidentiality.

Your safety

RAPAD Skilling is committed to providing a safe environment in which you can participate in training and assessment. The following guidelines are provided as a basis for safe practice in the training environment:

- Know and observe details of emergency response and evacuation plans;
- Do not undertake activities which may cause injury to self or others;
- Be responsible for your own actions;
- No smoking at the training and assessment facilities or offices;
- Report all potential hazards, accidents and near misses to the RTO staff;
- No consumption of alcohol within training and assessment facilities or during the conduct of training and assessment;
- Keep training and assessment areas neat and tidy at all times;

- Seek assistance if you volunteer to lift items e.g. move furniture in a training area; and
- Observe hygiene standards particularly in eating and bathroom areas.

Electrical equipment

- Electrical equipment that is not working should be reported to RTO staff.
- Electrical work should only be performed by appropriately licensed or trained personnel. Learners, trainers and assessors should not undertake any task related to fixing electrical equipment such as lighting or electrical training aids.

Fire safety

- RAPAD Skilling will undertake to communicate the procedures involved in evacuation and the location of fire equipment to learners at each facility for each training and assessment event; and to users of the office at least twice each year.
- All users of a training and assessment facility need to be familiar with the location of all EXITS and fire extinguishers. Users will consult available maps to determine location.
- It is the user's responsibility to understand fire drill procedures displayed around the premises.
- Users are asked to attend any sessions on fire safety procedures and the use of fire safety devices.

First aid

- Provision for first aid facilities are available where training is delivered.
- All accidents must be reported to staff.
- The accident and any aid administered must be recorded by staff involved.

Computer facilities

- Extended periods of work with computers can result in general fatigue and eye strain. Repetitive tasks and incorrect posture will result in consistent aches and pains.

- Current workplace health and safety guidelines indicate that people working for long periods at computers should organise their work so as to allow a five to ten-minute rest every hour. This rest should include a change of position and stretching exercises as appropriate.
- Posture can be improved by adjusting chair height so that the operator's feet are comfortably placed on the floor (or footrest) and your arms are at an approximately 90-degree angle.
- The screen should be positioned to avoid reflection from lights and windows and at a suitable distance so that it can be easily read.

Lifting

- Learners, trainers and assessors are encouraged not to lift anything related to the training and assessment provided by RAPAD Skilling unless they do so voluntarily and taking all responsibility for any injury caused.
- Never attempt to lift anything that is beyond your capacity.
- Always bend the knees and keep the back straight when picking up items.
- If you have experienced back problems in the past do not attempt to lift heavy objects at all. Ask someone else to do it for you.

Work and study areas

- Always ensure that all work areas are clean and clear of clutter so as to avoid the danger of accident by tripping or falling over.
- Place all rubbish in the bins provided.
- Ensure that kitchen bench spaces are left clean and tidy and that all dishes are washed.
- Do not leave tea towels or any cleaning cloths in a bundle on the bench tops or draped near any bin.
- Do not sit or climb on any desks or tables.
- Please do not eat in the training rooms. Please eat in the designated area.

Your equity

RAPAD Skilling is committed to ensuring that the training and assessment environment is free from discrimination and harassment. All RAPAD Skilling

staff members (including contractors) are aware that discrimination and harassment will not be tolerated under any circumstances. In the event that discrimination and harassment is found to have occurred disciplinary action will be taken against any staff member who breaches this policy. Suspected criminal behaviour will be reported to police authorities immediately. Learners should expect fair and friendly behaviour from RAPAD Skilling staff members and we apply complaint handling procedures advocated by the Australian Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission (HREOC).

Learners who feel that they have been discriminated against or harassed should report this information to a staff member of RAPAD Skilling that they feel they can trust. This will initiate a complaint handling procedure which will be fair and transparent and will protect your rights as a complainant. Alternatively, if a learner wishes to report an instance of discrimination or harassment to an agency external to RAPAD Skilling, they are advised to contact the HREOC Complaints Info-line on 1300 656 419.

Your privacy

RAPAD Skilling takes the privacy of learners very seriously and complies with all legislative requirements of the Australian Privacy Principles (2014).

Learner information is only shared with external agencies such as registering and licensing authorities to meet compliance requirements as a Registered Training Organisation (RTO). All information shared is kept in the strictest confidence by both parties and is available on request.

In some cases, we are required by law to make learner information available to others such as the National Centre for Vocational Education and Research. In all other cases RAPAD Skilling will seek the written permission of the learner for such disclosure.

Our guarantee

In the event that RAPAD Skilling are not able to carry on operation RAPAD Skilling will facilitate your enrolment transfer to another RTO, issue you with an appropriate refund for service not provided, and issue a Statement of Attainment based on completed units of competence.

Enrolment

The enrolment process may vary depending on the course you intend to study. Generally, the process is as follows:

- contact us with your enquiry whether it be over phone, email or in person – information/documentation will be provided (course flyer, handbook, student enrolment form, LLN, course information & declaration form)
- review course information provided
- provide identification and complete above documentation, return either in person or via email
- trainer will be in touch to discuss course details and unit selection if applicable
- pay relevant co-contribution or course fees prior to the commencement of training

Once all the above has been completed and processed, you will be enrolled into the course.

It is essential that we always keep our student records up to date. Please inform RAPAD Skilling of any changes to your personal details, such as name, address and phone number as soon as possible.

Unique Student Identifier (USI)

A USI is your individual education number for life. It gives you an online record of your VET training undertaken in Australia from January 2015 onwards.

It is requirement for all students undertaking nationally recognised training to have a USI. Unfortunately, without one we cannot issue qualification certificates or statements of attainment. It is therefore mandatory for all students to supply their USI on enrolment.

Subsidised training

The Queensland Government through the Department of Trade, Employment and Training (DTET) funds a variety of vocational education and training (VET) programs. Each program has its own funding arrangements and eligibility requirements.

Career Start – General Pathway

The Career Start General program gives eligible students the opportunity to complete a full certificate III level qualification that can lead to a job outcome or

career advancement. Students are only entitled to access government subsidised training for **one (1)** completed certificate III qualification under this program.

For this reason, it is particularly important that prior to signing an enrolment form and committing to a course of study which will use up the entitlement, you take time to consider the course you are choosing and to compare training options.

To access a subsidised training place under Career Start, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate III or higher qualification completed within the last 10 years (qualifications **completed** as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count);
- not be enrolled in another qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, whether funded by DTET or not (foundation skills qualifications do not count).

For training subsidised by the Queensland Government through DTET, students are required to contribute to the costs of training through a co-contribution fee. This fee may be paid on behalf of the student by their employer or a third party but cannot be paid or waived by RAPAD Skilling.

Concessional rates can apply in the circumstances below:

- student holds or is a named dependent on a valid Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card
- student identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander

A student's eligibility for concession will be confirmed on enrolment.

The co-contribution fee is calculated using the below rates:

- non-concessional student \$100/unit
- concessional student \$50/unit

(less any credit transfer units as these are fee exempt)

Co-contribution fees are required to be paid on enrolment.

VET in School (VETiS) 2026

Vocational education and training in Schools (VETiS) is funded by Queensland Government. It aligns school-based training with the needs of industry and creates career pathways for secondary students.

Queensland school students can undertake nationally recognised vocational education and training (VET) qualifications while they are still at school. These courses can be taken in Years 10, 11 and 12.

Students can undertake VETiS:

- as part of their school studies – delivered and resourced by a school that is a registered training organisation (RTO)
- by enrolling with an external RTO – funded either by VETiS or through fee-for-service arrangements. This is where fees are paid by an individual such as a student or parent, or another entity like a community or industry group
- as a school-based apprentice or trainee – funded either by the Queensland Government or fee-for-service arrangements.

Through VETiS, secondary students can access one funded training opportunity at a time. For example, a funded certificate or a funded school-based apprenticeship or traineeship

School students do not have to pay any student or co-contribution fees for the VETiS 2026 program.

The Queensland Government covers the cost by paying the SAS so students can do the training for free.

Career Boost Program

Career Boost will help Queenslanders to level-up at work, enabling them to grow their skills to existing or new roles, and to support productivity growth and workplace innovation.

Career Start – Apprenticeship/traineeship Pathway

The program delivers training to help individuals develop the higher-level skills needed to secure employment, advance their careers, or progress to further education and training.

Career Boost replaces funding previously available through the Higher-Level Skills and User Choice programs.

To access a subsidised training place under Career Boost, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate IV or higher qualification (including tertiary)

Students are required to contribute to the costs of their training through a co-contribution fee. This fee may be paid on behalf of the student by their employer or a third party but cannot be paid or waived by RAPAD Skilling.

Concessional rates can apply in the circumstances below:

- student holds or is a named dependent on a valid Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card
- student identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander

A student's eligibility for concession will be confirmed on enrolment.

The co-contribution fee is calculated using the below rates:

- non-concessional student \$100/unit
- concessional student \$50/unit

(less any credit transfer units as these are fee exempt)

Co-contribution fees are required to be paid on enrolment prior to the commencement of training.

Career Start provides Queenslanders with skills and support to start their career.

The program provides training to help job seekers secure a job and supports those already employed to move into more skilled roles or full-time employment, including after completing an apprenticeship or traineeship.

From 1 July 2025, Career Start will provide eligible Queenslanders with:

- access to certificate III qualifications in priority and emerging industries
- access to apprenticeship and traineeship training in priority and emerging industries
- access to lower-level qualifications identified by industry as the entry point for jobs
- expanded access to foundation skills such as language, literacy, numeracy, digital literacy and employability skills
- increased access to training in regional and remote areas
- supported training pathways for women and priority cohorts to take-up skilled careers.

Career Start replaces funding previously available through the Certificate 3 Guarantee and User Choice programs.

To access a subsidised training place under Career Start, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate III or higher qualification completed within the last 10 years (qualifications **completed** as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count);

Apprentices and trainees can only receive one (1) government contribution for a Career Start funded qualification at any single point in time e.g. a student is not funded to undertake two apprenticeships or traineeships at the same time. However, students can

access a maximum of **two (2)** government funding contributions under the current Career Start program.

Under this program students are required to pay a co-contribution fee. This fee can be paid on behalf of the student by their employer or a third party but cannot be paid or waived by RAPAD Skilling.

Student co-contribution fees under this program are set at \$1.60 per nominal hour for each unit of competency. On enrolment an invoice will be provided outlining the total cost of the co-contribution fee for the student's qualification/unit selection.

Partial or full exemption can apply in the circumstances below:

Partial exemption applies if:

- student holds or is a named dependent on a valid Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card
- student identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander

Full exemption applies if:

- student is completing their traineeship or apprenticeship as a school-based arrangement
- student is aged under 25 and completing a traineeship or apprenticeship in either Individual Support or Civil Construction.

Fees and refunds

RAPAD Skilling offers a range of qualifications and stand-alone courses on a fee for service basis.

In accordance with applicable State legislation, RAPAD Skilling is entitled to charge fees for items or services provided to learners undertaking a course of study. These charges are generally for items such as enrolment administration, course materials or text books, learner services and training and assessment services.

Reissue of Statement of Attainment

Requests for reissuing of a Statement of Attainment, Certificate or card require the completion of a 'Replacement Card/Certificate Form'.

Please be advised the reprint process may take a minimum of a 5-days to be completed.

Costs to reissue a Statement of Attainment, Certificate or card is \$ 40.00 which includes emailing and printing of the certification, and registered post. Please allow 7 working days minimum for arrival. If you require a digital copy only, the cost for re-issuance is \$25.

Fees payable

Fees are payable when the learner has received notification of enrolment. Fees must be paid in full if less than \$1500.00 or part payment to a maximum of \$1500.00 if the total course cost is more than \$1500.00, within five days of receiving this notification from RAPAD Skilling. On course commencement \$500.00 or the remaining fees whichever is lesser, will be due. If the course is more than \$2000.00 the final payment is due at the completion of study and prior to the qualification being issued. RAPAD Skilling may discontinue training if fees are not paid as required.

Learner cancellation

If you wish to cancel your enrolment part way through a training program you must notify RAPAD Skilling in writing at the soonest opportunity if consideration of fee reimbursement is required. This may be via email or letter. RAPAD Skilling staff are able to advise you of your rights with regards to the refunding of tuition fees. They will also advise of other options such as suspending the enrolment and re-commencing in another scheduled training program.

If you give written notice to cancel your enrolment and are eligible for a refund you will be provided with a Refund Request Form.

Refunds

- If you give notice to cancel your enrolment more than 10 days prior to the commencement of a program, you will be entitled to a full refund of fees paid.
- If you give notice to cancel your enrolment less than 10 days prior to the commencement of a program, you will be entitled to a 75% refund of fees paid. The amount retained (25%) by RAPAD

Skilling is required to cover the costs of staff and resources which will have already been committed based on your initial intention to undertake the training.

- If you cancel your enrolment within 2 days of your training program commencing, you will not be entitled to a refund of fees. You will be offered the opportunity to change to a future dated training program and your fees will be held in credit for you.
- If you fail to turn up or cancel your enrolment after a training program has commenced, you will not be entitled to a refund of fees and all money paid will be forfeited.

Where refunds are approved, the refund payment will be paid within 14 days from the receipt of written notice to cancel of enrolment. For the tuition fees to be refunded a Refund Request Form needs to be completed.

If you have purchased a text or training workbooks and subsequently cancel, RAPAD Skilling will not refund monies for the text unless a written request for a refund is received and RAPAD Skilling is satisfied that the text is in as-new condition.

You will receive a full refund, with no associated administration charges in the following circumstances:

- The course or training activity is cancelled
- The course is rescheduled to a time when you are unavailable.
- You are not allocated a training position due to maximum participant numbers having already been met.

Replacement of text and training workbooks

If you require replacement of issued text or training work books you will be liable for additional charges to cover the cost of replacement.

Payment methods

RAPAD Skilling accepts payment for fees using:

- Electronic Funds Transfer
- Credit/Debit Card – (fees apply, please enquire)
- Cheque (made payable to RAPAD Skilling)

- Payment in cash in person to the RAPAD Skilling office at 117 Eagle Street Longreach.

Failure to make payment

If payment is not made according to the agreed terms, RAPAD Skilling may find it necessary to suspend training and/or withhold issuing certification until payment is received.

If you are experiencing financial hardship, please contact RAPAD Skilling to discuss your payment options.

Access to your records

You are entitled to have access to your learner file and learning and assessment records on request. You may require these to monitor your progress with training or simply to go back and confirm something in a previous training module. Whilst these records will be retained by RAPAD Skilling, you are welcome to have access anytime to view your records in the presence of a RAPAD Skilling representative. Your learner file is not to be taken away from the RAPAD Skilling office. You may request a copy.

The record remains the property of RAPAD Skilling and is to be retained to comply with regulatory requirements. If you require access to your records, just ask your trainer and it will be organised at the earliest convenience.

Our continuous improvement of services

RAPAD Skilling is committed to the continuous improvement of our training and assessment services, learner services and management systems. Central to this commitment is our approach to continuous improvement and the procedures we apply to achieve systematic and sustained improvement.

Suggesting improvements

The primary method of reporting opportunities for improvement by learners is via the continuous improvement reporting procedure. This procedure allows any person to raise a Continuous Improvement Report for consideration by the Continuous Improvement Committee. Often these reports will be generated after an opportunity for improvement has been identified by a staff member or learner. The Continuous Improvement Report template is available on request. Learners are encouraged to provide

feedback to RAPAD Skilling so we can improve our services in the future.

Learner satisfaction survey

At the completion of your training program, you will be issued with a Learner Satisfaction Survey. This is a nationally consistent survey tool which is designed to collect feedback from learners about their experience with an RTO and in undertaking nationally recognised training. The completion and return of this survey is important to RAPAD Skilling for our ongoing improvement of services and to enable us to report this information to our registering authority. Your assistance in gathering this survey data is greatly appreciated.

Your language, literacy and numeracy skills

Language, literacy and numeracy skills are critical to almost all areas of work. This is particularly true in many vocations where language, literacy and numeracy skills influence the performance of workplace tasks such as measuring, weighing and comprehending written work instructions.

To support this approach RAPAD Skilling will:

- Assess a learner's language, literacy and numeracy skills during their enrolment to ensure they have adequate skills to complete the training;
- Support learners during their study with training and assessment materials and strategies that are easily understood and suitable to the level of the workplace skills being delivered;
- Provide clear information to learners about the detail of the language, literacy and numeracy assistance available;
- Refer learners to external language, literacy and numeracy support services that are beyond the support available within RAPAD Skilling and where this level of support is assessed as necessary; and
- Negotiate an extension of time to complete training programs if necessary.

Making complaints and appeals

RAPAD Skilling is committed to providing a fair and transparent complaints and appeals process that includes access to an independent external body if necessary.

What is a complaint?

A complaint is negative feedback about services or staff which has not been resolved locally. A complaint may be received by RAPAD Skilling in any form and does not need to be formally documented by the complainant in order to be acted on. Complaints may be made by any person but are generally made by learners and/or employers.

What is an appeal?

An appeal is an application by a learner for reconsideration of an unfavourable decision or finding during training and/or assessment. An appeal must be made in writing and specify the particulars of the decision or finding in dispute. Appeals must be submitted to RAPAD Skilling within 28 days of the learner being informed of the assessment decision or finding.

Early resolution or complaints and appeals

In all cases, issues that arise during training and assessment that are the source of frustration or are in dispute should be resolved at the time they occur between the persons involved, where possible. Sometimes, it will not be possible and in this case you are encouraged to come forward and inform us of your concerns with the confidence that you will be treated fairly.

Complaint and appeals handling

RAPAD Skilling undertakes to apply the following principles to its complaints and appeals handling:

- A written record of all complaints and appeals is to be kept by RAPAD Skilling including all details of lodgement, response and resolution.
- A complainant or person lodging an appeal is to be provided an opportunity to formally present his or her case at minimal or no cost.
- Each complainant or person lodging an appeal may be accompanied and/or assisted by a support person at any relevant meeting.
- The complainant or person lodging an appeal is to be provided a written statement of the outcome, including details of the reasons for the outcome.

- The complainant or person lodging an appeal is to have the opportunity for a person or a body that is independent of RAPAD Skilling to review his or her complaint or appeal following the internal RAPAD Skilling complaint or appeals process. It is noted that a review of findings by an independent person or body will generally only relate to the appeals process and is less likely to be required in complaints handling.
- RAPAD Skilling shall maintain the enrolment of the complainant or person lodging an appeal during the complaint or appeals process.
- Decisions or outcomes of the complaint or appeals process that find in the favour of the learner or otherwise shall be implemented immediately.
- Complaints and appeals are to be handled in the strictest of confidence. No RAPAD Skilling representative is to disclose information to any person without the permission of the RAPAD Skilling General Manager. Decisions to release information to third parties are only to be done after the complainant or person lodging the appeal has given permission for this to occur.
- Complaints and appeals are to be considered based on procedural fairness and lead to opportunities for improvement as a Continuous Improvement Report.

The timeframes for processing are:

Complaints

The General Manager will finalise and provide the complainant with his or her response to the as soon as possible but no later than 10 working days from when the complaint is received.

Appeals

Applications for reconsideration of an unfavorable decision or finding will be treated with the highest importance.

Learners must make an appeal in writing and specify the particulars of the decision or finding in dispute.

- Appeals must be lodged within 28 days of when the decision or finding is communicated to the learner. The following procedure will be followed when an application for appeal is received:

- The General Manager will arrange for a re-assessment of the learner as soon as practicable but no longer than 20 working days. The learner is also to be offered the opportunity to undertake additional training before this re-assessment. The learner may be offered up to 3 re-assessments.
- If after the reassessment, the learner remains not-yet-competent and is unsatisfied with the assessment outcome, the General Manager will meet with the learner within 10 working days from the notification of the decision to discuss the assessment process and the assessment outcome.
- If after consultation with the General Manager, the learner remains unsatisfied with the assessment process, the learner is to be provided the Complaints and Appeals Form and the matter is to be dealt with in accordance with the complaint handling procedure.

Recognition of your existing skills and knowledge

In accordance with the requirements of the Standards for NVR Registered Training Organisations, RAPAD Skilling provides the opportunity for learners to apply to have prior learning recognised toward a qualification or units of competence for which they are enrolled.

What is recognition?

Recognition involves the assessment of previously unrecognised skills and knowledge that an individual has achieved outside the formal education and training system. Recognition assesses this unrecognised learning against the requirements of a unit of competence, in respect of both entry requirements and outcomes to be achieved. By removing the need for duplication of learning, recognition encourages an individual to continue upgrading their skills and knowledge through structured education and training towards formal qualifications and improved employment outcomes. This has benefits for the individual and industry. Most importantly, it should be noted that recognition is just another form of assessment.

Recognition guidelines

The following guidelines are to be followed when an application for recognition is received:

- Any learner is entitled to apply for recognition in a course or qualification in which they are currently enrolled.
- Learners may not apply for recognition for units of competence or a qualification which are not included in RAPAD Skilling’s scope of registration.
- Whilst learners may apply for recognition at any time, they are encouraged to apply before commencing a training program. This will reduce unnecessary training and guide the learner down a more efficient path to competence.
- Learners who are currently enrolled in a training program are eligible to apply for recognition in that program at no additional charge.
- Assessment via recognition is to apply the principles of assessment and the rules of evidence.
- Recognition may only be awarded for whole units of competence.

Forms of evidence for recognition

Recognition acknowledges that workplace skills and knowledge may be gained through a variety of ways including both formal and informal learning or through work-based or life experience.

In evaluating assessment evidence, RAPAD Skilling applies the following rules of evidence that the assessment is:

- Sufficient,
- Valid,
- Authentic, and
- Current.

Like assessment, recognition is a process whereby evidence is collected and a judgement is made by an assessor or assessment team. The judgement is made on evidence provided by candidates of the skills and knowledge that they have previously learnt through work, study, life and other experiences, and that they are currently using. It also includes evidence to confirm a candidate’s ability to adapt prior learning or current competence to the context of the intended workplace or industry.

Forms of evidence toward recognition may include:

- Work records;
- Records of workplace training;

- Assessments of current skills;
- Assessments of current knowledge;
- Third party reports from current and previous supervisors or managers;
- Evidence of relevant unpaid or volunteer experience;
- Examples of work products;
- Observation by an assessor in the workplace;
- Performance appraisal; or
- Duty statements.

Many of these forms of evidence would not be sufficient on their own. When combined together, with a number of evidence items, the candidate will start to provide a strong case for competence. RAPAD Skilling reserves the right to require candidates to undertake practical assessment activities of skills and knowledge in order to satisfy itself of a candidate’s current competence.

Getting credit for your current competence

RAPAD Skilling acknowledges the requirement as an RTO to recognise the awards issued by other RTOs. This is limited to outcomes that are drawn from the national skills framework being units of competence awarded and accurately identified in statements of attainment, qualifications and USI transcripts.

What is credit transfer?

Credit transfer is the recognition of learning achieved through formal education and training. Under the Standards for NVR Registered Training Organisations, qualifications and statements of attainment issued by any RTO are to be accepted and recognised by all other RTOs. Credit Transfer allows a learner to be awarded a unit of competency/module based on successful completion of the unit which has been previously awarded.

Evidence requirements

If you are seeking credit you are required to present your statement of attainment, qualification certificate or USI transcript for examination by RAPAD Skilling. These documents will provide the detail of what units of competence the applicant has been previously issued.

Credit transfer guidelines

The following guidelines are to be followed in relation to credit transfers:

- Any learner is entitled to apply for credit transfer in a course or qualification in which they are currently enrolled.
- Learners may not apply for credit transfer for units of competence or qualification which are not included in RAPAD Skilling's scope of registration.
- Whilst learners may apply for credit transfer at any time, they are encouraged to apply before commencing a training program. This will reduce unnecessary training and guide the learner down a more efficient path to competence.
- The learner does not incur any fees for credit transfer and RAPAD Skilling does not receive any funding when credit transfer is granted.
- Credit transfer may only be awarded for whole units of competence. Where a mapping guide identifies a partial credit, this will not be considered for credit transfer and applicants will be advised to seek recognition.

Assessment information

A variety of assessment methods are assessed as part of each unit of competency. These include written knowledge/questions, project work, verbal questioning, role plays/simulated observations and workplace/third party observations. It is expected that all assessments are to be completed for each unit in your qualification/course.

The outcomes for all assessment are either competent or not yet competent. If you are judged as not yet competent the trainer will provide you with feedback about what further information or evidence, you are required to provide. Our trainers work closely with each student to ensure they are successful in their studies.

Learning support

Learning support is available for all students. Whether you need help with reading, writing or using a computer we are committed to assisting you to be successful in your course.
